FY12 Dues

Which membership level is right for your agency?

“My adult literacy program depends on volunteer tutors as well as professional staff.”

We recommend the Regular Membership so you can send multiple literacy volunteers and staff members to all our trainings year-round.

“My program has only one or two tutors,” or “My program has no tutors at all.”

We recommend the Professional Development Membership so you can send key staff members to select literacy trainings.

“My program focuses on children’s education and parent engagement - not adult literacy.”

We recommend the Family Literacy Membership so you can send can send multiple staff members to our FLO trainings.

Regular Membership Dues for Agencies

Agency dues are on a sliding scale, based on agency literacy budget.

- \$100 (literacy budget of \$25,000 or less)
- \$250 (literacy budget of \$25,001-\$49,999)
- \$350 (literacy budget of \$50,000-\$99,999)
- \$400 (literacy budget of \$100,000-\$199,999)
- \$450 (literacy budget of \$200,000-\$249,999)
- \$500 (literacy budget of \$250,000-\$499,999)
- \$750 (literacy budget of \$500,000-\$999,999)
- \$1,000 (literacy budget of \$1,000,000 and over)
